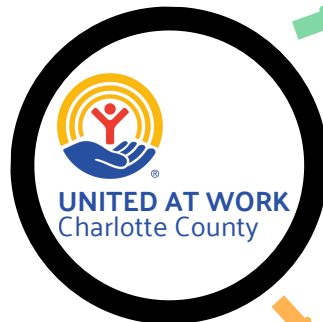




Community Resiliency through **United at Work (UAW)**
